THE CATTLE DRIVE MURAL



Doug Quarles, our muralist, has completed the Cattle Drive Mural on San Pedro & 4th Streets. We began raising funds for this project in 2014. Our first large donation was \$2,300 from a parking lot "yard" sale by the Walmart Employees. Later came a \$4,000 grant from Union Pacific Foundation, and \$6,000 from co-sponsoring Butterfield Stage Days for two years. Even with additional fundraisers, we were still a long way from realizing our goal. We decided to follow the unique idea that Lake Placid, Florida used by selling cattle brand sponsorships. We took it one step further by encouraging family members to honor their ancestors by showcasing them atop a favorite mount. At long last, we reached our goal to complete this mural.

Take a look at that first steer. His eyes follow you wherever you go. I bet he's saying, "This is my street, Bud! Move on!"

The first cowboy is Sonny Lawson riding for the **Spear 7** brand (the Lawson Family). Next is Rusty Glenn of the **Hollow T** brand (Link Glenn Ranch). Look for the horse with the **Pony Track M** brand. That's George, who carries the mail for the Benson Pony Express. He belongs to our president, Cindy Allen. Then we have Juan Diaz Gamez with the X3 Ranch - that's the Bernardo Gamez Ranch. Bringing up the rear—literally—is a horse with the brand of **MJM**. That's me—Mary Jo Martin — atop the horse is a Vaquero, commemorating our earlier "cowboys", the Mexican and Spanish Vaqueros. The chuck wagon is courtesy of Mahlon Mackenzie, of the Mackenzie Ranch.
